This matter is before the Court on Defendant/Counterclaim Plaintiff, Jeffrey Minnich,'s ("Minnich") Motion to Reinstate Case and Motion For Reconsideration, both filed October 11, 2017.

For reasons that defy any semblance of a rational explanation, this case has languished about since December 3, 2010 when the first complaint was filed. It appears, though of course is wholly unclear, that appeals were filed on January 25, 2012 and February 6, 2012 that were then dismissed? Absent a jurisprudential Rosetta Stone to cipher this quagmire of litigious machinations, the Court implores the parties to draft readable, clear, pleadings to assist in the identification of legal issues and the procedural quick sand into which this case devolved.

Accordingly, all interested parties are hereby granted leave to reply to Minnich's two Motions on or before November 3, 2017. No reply or rebuttal briefs will be considered. Court to rule thereafter and will schedule an oral hearing if necessary.
